

# HARVEST COMMUNITY CHURCH: WARREN, MINNESOTA

In 2008, Pastor Eric Berglund led a team from Cottonwood Community Church (North Dakota) to plant Harvest Community Church in Warren, Minnesota.

The first way God blessed the new church was by giving them a large building to meet in, for only \$1,000.

On January 9th 2008, the City of Warren offered their old opera house for sale by sealed bid. HCC's bid of \$1,000.00 was accepted and renovation began immediately. Volunteers removed years of clutter, installed new windows, removed the old 'drop' ceiling tiles, added insulation, removed some old walls and added offices.

Harvest Community Church's grand opening service on Sunday Sept. 7th was a huge success. Their goal was for 50-60 people for the first weekend and 100 in

attendance by May, 2009. The first Sunday's attendance was 106. God did more then they imagined. Not only is the church doing well, but they are hoping to plant another church in Bemidji, MN, next year.

### UPDATE FROM THE PHILIPPINES: HERSCHEL MARTINDALE

Two years ago, I joined Mike Bergen on one of his trips to the Philippines (he has been working with the church there since 1990).

While there, I met a young pastor who asked if I would consider coming to train young people in his church for leadership. I went home, prayed and felt God clearly leading me to come back and work with his church. I agreed to come every four months for a year. Mike and I agreed to work together to see what God might do.

On our first trip, we had 5 trainees for the Leadership class. On our 2nd trip, we had 15 trainees, on our next trip we had 20 trainees. On our trip last October, we are now working with 3 churches and had 75 trainees in our leadership class. The 3 churches that we work with are all in the extreme poverty area of Manila. Many families cannot even afford to send all their children to school. If a child cannot get an education, when they grow up most can only sell drugs or become a prostitute. We now assist 32

children from these churches to be able to attend school. I talk to the pastors several times every week. I ask them the hard questions, and challenge them to give regular accountability to the people in their churches that are being trained.

We need much prayer and financial assistance as we continue the work there. We would value your involvement and any questions that you might have about this ministry.
